Dear Paine's Customer:

Paine's will be implementing a new residential automated curbside single stream recycling collection system. This program will make it easier and more convenient for you, our customers, to recycle. In an effort to make this a smooth transition, we have listed pertinent information below on how the new system will operate:

This is your new 95 gallon blue container which will become your new recycle barrel starting June 28, 2010.

Starting June 28, 2010, your recycle collection will be done every two weeks on the same day as your trash collection. Recycle collections will be done utilizing an "A" and "B" week schedule. Your recyclables will be collected during the "A" week. Please see the calendar on the reverse side for collection schedules. Trash collection will continue to be done weekly.

Trash and recycle routes begin at 6:00 am so please have your barrel(s) out early. We recommend putting them out the night before. Place the barrel(s) within two (2) feet of the curb with the arrows on the lid facing the street. The handle used to maneuver the barrel should be facing your home. Please place the barrel(s) at least two (2) feet apart and away from any obstacles like mailboxes and landscape structures.

You may keep your existing recycle bin and continue to use it inside your home for your recyclables. If you do not wish to keep your bin, you may drop it off at the Simsbury Bulky Waste Facility, 74 Wolcott Road, Simsbury, CT during normal hours of operation, Wednesdays and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm. Unwanted bins may also be dropped off at Paine's, 54 Floydville Road, East Granby, CT during normal business hours M-F 7:30 am to 4:00 pm. For our customers living in Avon, Canton and the Northwest corridor, we have scheduled Wednesday, July 21, 2010 for collection of unwanted recycle bins. You will need to call in by 4:00 pm on Monday, July 19, 2010 to have your name added to the list for collection. Have your bin out by 6:00 am on July 21 for removal. Do not dispose of unwanted bins in your blue recycling barrel or trash barrel. Keep in mind, once automated single stream recycle service starts, you will not be able to place this recycle bin by the curb for pick-up.

Remember, your new service does not begin until June 28, 2010, at which time all recyclables must be placed in your 95 gallon blue barrel for collection.

Recycling Facts:

- One study says Americans throw away 44 percent of the bulk mail unopened, yet still spend eight months per lifetime opening bulk mail.
- If we recycled every plastic bottle we used, we would keep two billion tons of plastic out of the trash
- New plastic is made from petroleum, so using recycled plastic products reduces our dependency on imported oil.
- The aluminum can is 100 percent recyclable and can be used to make new beverage cans indefinitely.
- Four pounds of bauxite are saved for every pound of aluminum recycled.
- Enough aluminum is thrown away to rebuild the entire fleet of commercial jet air liners four times every year.
- Last year, Americans recycled enough aluminum cans to conserve the energy equivalent of more than 15 million barrels of oil.
- Recycled glass generates 20 percent less air pollution and 50 percent less water pollution.
- Glass can be reused an infinite number of times; over 41 billion glass containers are made each year.
- Recycled paper saves 60 percent energy compared to the production of virgin paper.
- Recycling of each ton of paper saves 17 trees and 7000 gallons of water.
- When you shop, make sure you look for the "recycled" symbol on items you buy. Buying recycled products saves precious natural resources – buying recycled products is good for the environment.

These are just some of the reasons to recycle; maybe the question should be,

"How can I recycle more?"

Clean cardboard and boxboard
Paper egg cartons
Office and school papers
Aluminum cans and clean foil
Empty tin and steel aerosol cans
All plastic containers labeled #1 through #7
Aseptic packaging, (gable top milk and juice containers)
Shredded paper in paper bags

What is NOT recyclable in this system?

No garbage
No plastic bags
No food tainted items, (used paper plates or boxes, paper towels or paper napkins)
No polystyrene or Styrofoam
No motor oil bottles
No hazardous chemical containers
No electronics or batteries
No foam egg cartons
No light bulbs
No pizza boxes
No mirrors or window glass
